The Chair of the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011) concerning Al-Qaida and associated individuals and entities presents his compliments to the Permanent Representatives of Member States and to the Permanent Observers of Non-Member States to the United Nations and wishes to convey the following:

On **28 September 2015**, the Committee approved the **addition of the entries** specified below to its List of individuals and entities subject to the assets freeze, travel ban and arms embargo set out in paragraph 1 of Security Council resolution 2161 (2014) adopted under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations.

NARRATIVE SUMMARIES

A. Individuals

QDi.356. Aqsa Mahmood

Date on which the narrative summary became available on the Committee's website: 28 September 2015

Aqsa Mahmood was listed on 28 September 2015 pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 4 of resolution 2161 (2014) as being associated with Al-Qaida for "participating in the financing, planning, facilitating, preparing, or perpetrating of acts or activities by, in conjunction with, under the name of, on behalf of, or in support of", "recruiting for" and "otherwise supporting acts or activities of" Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant, listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115).

Additional information:

Aqsa Mahmood travelled to the Syrian Arab Republic in November 2013 to join Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL), listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115). Mahmood is believed to be a key figure in the Al-Khanssaa brigade, a female ISIL brigade established in Al-Raqqa to enforce ISIL's interpretation of Sharia law.

Mahmood has since maintained an active social media presence, under the name Umm Layth. Mahmood has recruited and supported ISIL online; she has condoned previous attacks in Europe and elsewhere and encouraged further attacks to be carried out. She has posted images of executions carried out by ISIL fighters and messages to the West saying "your countries will be destroyed [and] blood will be spilled". Mahmood is also responsible for recruiting others, particularly women, to join ISIL and uses social media to offer advice on how to travel to Syria.

In a post on her blog on 29 June 2015, Mahmood celebrated the terrorist attacks claimed by ISIL in Tunisia, France and Kuwait describing them as "revenge" and "a day that would go down in history".

Nasser Ahmed Muthana was listed on 28 September 2015 pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 4 of resolution 2161 (2014) as being associated with Al-Qaida for “participating in the financing, planning, facilitating, preparing, or perpetrating of acts or activities by, in conjunction with, under the name of, on behalf of, or in support of” and “recruiting for” Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant, listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115).

Additional information:

Nasser Ahmed Muthana travelled from the United Kingdom to the Syrian Arab Republic in 2013 to fight for Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL), listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115). Nasser Ahmed Muthana has appeared in ISIL propaganda and recruitment videos alongside fellow British nationals, including an ISIL recruitment video in 2014, titled “There is No Life without Jihad”, calling for Western Muslims to join the wars and fight in the Syrian Arab Republic and Iraq. Nasser Ahmed Muthana has an active social media presence and has posted images of homemade explosives and photographs of a bombed Syrian army base on social media, claiming: “Army base before and after, I’m getting good with these bombs”. Nasser Ahmed Muthana has also threatened the United Kingdom on social media, posting comments saying that the United Kingdom “should be afraid [if he] comes back with the skills [he has] gained.”

QDi.359 Omar Ali Hussain

Omar Ali Hussain was listed on 28 September 2015 pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 4 of resolution 2161 (2014) as being associated with Al-Qaida for "participating in the financing, planning, facilitating, preparing, or perpetrating of acts or activities by, in conjunction with, under the name of, on behalf of, or in support of", "recruiting for" and "otherwise supporting acts or activities of" Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant, listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115).

Additional information:

In January 2014, Omar Ali Hussain travelled to the Syrian Arab Republic to fight for Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL), listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115), and has since demonstrated an active online presence on extremist websites and social media. Hussain uses this online presence to recruit individuals for combat and for operational roles in ISIL and to condone the brutal activities of ISIL. Hussain uses his online presence to glorify ISIL, claiming that there are "beautiful jobs for those who truly wish to reap rewards". Hussain has also used social media to encourage women and children to travel to the Syrian Arab Republic in order to recruit the "next generation".

Hussain is featured in a two minute video titled "Message of the Mujahid" produced by Al-I'tisaam Foundation, the media wing of ISIL, on 3 October 2014. In this video, Hussain condemns "the West" and calls on British Muslims to join ISIL by fighting abroad or by committing lone wolf attacks domestically. In August 2014, Hussain spoke publically in the British media confirming that he was fighting for ISIL. In this interview, Hussain claimed that he would only return to the United Kingdom to "plant a bomb".

**QDi.360 Sally-Anne Frances Jones**

Sally-Anne Frances Jones was listed on 28 September 2015 pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 4 of resolution 2161 (2014) as being associated with Al-Qaida for “participating in the financing, planning, facilitating, preparing, or perpetrating of acts or activities by, in conjunction with, under the name of, on behalf of, or in support of”, “recruiting for” and “otherwise supporting acts or activities of” the Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant, listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115).

Additional information:

Sally-Anne Jones travelled from the the United Kingdom to the Syrian Arab Republic in 2013 to join Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL), listed as Al-Qaida in Iraq (QDe.115), alongside her husband, Junaid Hussain (not listed).

Jones has an active social media presence and uses social media to recruit women to join ISIL and has provided practical advice on how to travel to the Syrian Arab Republic to support ISIL.

Under the pseudonym Umm Hussain al-Britani, Jones has posted messages in support of ISIL as well as extremist comments on social media, writing: “You Christians all need beheading with a nice blunt knife and stuck on the railings at Raqqa... Come here I’ll do it for you.” Jones has also posted images of herself on social media posing with weapons. In August 2015, Jones encouraged individuals purporting to aspire to conduct attacks in the United Kingdom offering guidance on how to construct homemade bombs.
